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About Our Program

NEW's Fiscal Sponsorship program offers partnerships to a range of nonprofit projects working throughout the country. While NEW's work in our other programs is predominantly focused on SE Michigan, in fiscal sponsorship, mission fit and values alignment are more important than physical location. We only require that potential sponsorship partners investigate options geographically closer to their location and eliminate those possibilities prior to starting a discussion with NEW (Nonprofit Enterprise at Work).

Fiscal sponsorship is a legal relationship through which a 501(c)(3) public charitable organization -- like NEW -- sponsors an individual or group requiring the benefits of the tax-exempt, legal, and audit status of the sponsoring organization to realize a project.

NEW has provided fiscal sponsorship services to innovative and impactful projects and organizations since 2016.

NEW'S Fiscal Sponsor Program currently provides one type of fiscal sponsorship support to projects: Grantor-Grantee Sponsorship, also known as Model C Fiscal Sponsorship.

For NEW to consider your project for grantor-grantee fiscal sponsorship, the project should:

- · Tightly align with NEW's mission to realize a more just and thriving society
- Comply with the guidelines for exempt activities under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- · Be a state-registered corporation, nonprofit, LLC, or sole proprietorship
- Have an established system for bookkeeping and accounting
- Anticipate funding of \$10,000 or more



What Does Fiscal Sponsorship Involve?

Grantor-Grantee (Model C)

With grantor-grantee fiscal sponsorship, the project remains independent from NEW and is responsible for managing its own tax reporting and liability issues. NEW receives contributed funds such as grants and tax-exempt donations on behalf of the project and distributes those funds to the project to realize the project's purpose.

The fiscal sponsorship relationship is initially funding-specific and requires confident expectation of grant or other funding in the amount of \$10,000.00 within the first twelve months of the relationship. Following the initial period, the relationship may remain active so long as funding in any amount is expected.

NEW's administrative support services are limited to those necessary for receiving and overseeing the funds:


- Receiving funds and distribution of donor tax letters
- Accounting and compliance related to receipt of contributed funds
- Limited fundraising support, including grant reporting guidance and an online donation page upon request.

The fee for most grantor-grantee fiscal sponsorship relationships is 5% of project funds. Projects hosted on Open Collective incur a 6% fee to offset platform expenses. In rare cases, projects requiring a higher level of support or expecting a high number of small donations on a regular basis may be asked to pay a fee of up to 7%.


